



DR JENNIFER COOK

It is with great sorrow that we learned that Dr Jennifer Cook passed away on February 1, 2018. Since 1993, Jennifer served as an English Language Editor for Acta Neurobiologiae Experimentalis. She contributed greatly to the success of ANE after its collapse during Poland's Martial Law in eighties. Her almost anonymous, but dedicated work for our Journal added to the successful relaunch of ANE to the research market. She was an outstanding friend, with a generous and kind approach to all who knew her.

Jennifer Cook was born on October 8, 1960 in Chattanooga, Tennessee and graduated from Indiana University School of Medicine. In her early career she carried out neuroscience research resulting in 14 articles published in scientific journals. In 1990, she married W. Jeffrey Wilson, also a neuroscientist. They moved to the Marshall County with her family in 1999 and she worked at Albion College as a Coordinator and then Associate Director of the Foundation for Undergraduate Research, Scholarship, and Creative Activity (FURSCA) during the period 2000 to 2007. In 1993, Jennifer and Jeffrey spent six months in Poland, where she taught English to Polish scientists and began working as English Language Editor for Acta Neurobiologiae Experimentalis. Jennifer and Jeffrey again returned to Poland for six months in 2009, taking their three children with them and making friends with many colleagues at the Nencki Institute.
